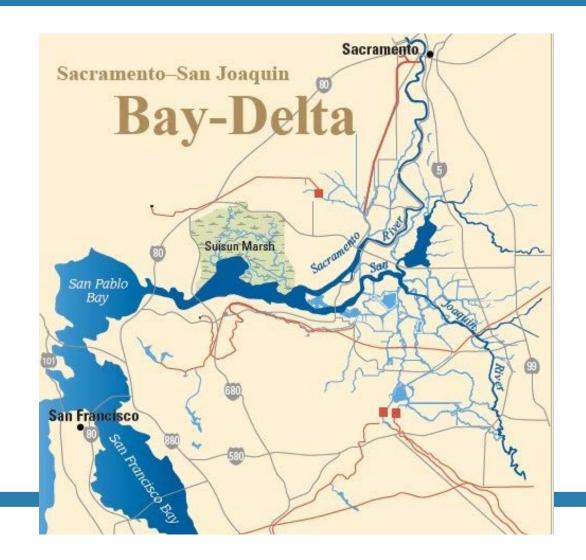

Construction began in the 1960s



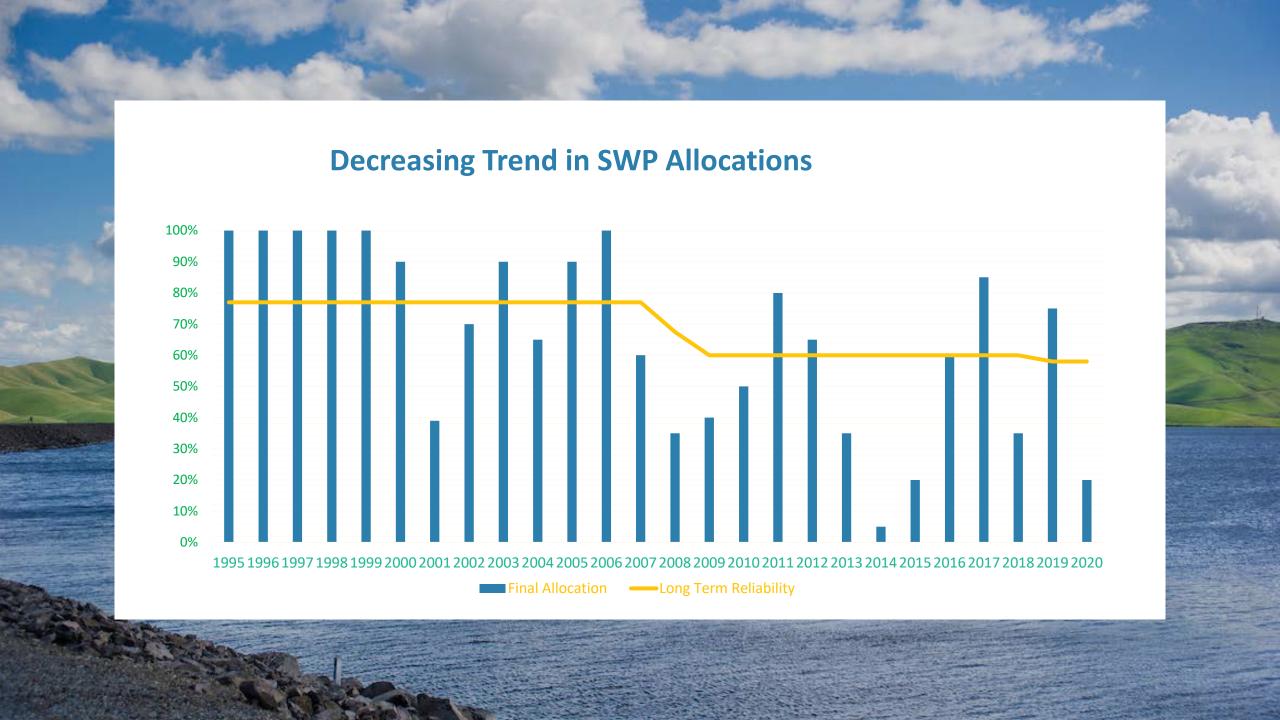
# State Water Project Delta Facilities



# **Current Status of Delta Environment**

- The regulatory environment in the Delta is always changing
- Long-term SWP reliability<sup>1</sup> has dropped from 76% to
   58% over the last 20 years
  - Trends suggest further declines are likely (assumed at 52%)<sup>2</sup>
- Climate change impacts are uncertain
- A Delta conveyance solution is predicted to restore reliability
