2014/2015 GOALS FOR THE ASSOCIATION

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Commissioners approve the recommended 2014/2015 Goals for the Antelope Valley State Water Contractors Association and direct staff to dedicate resources to accomplish the proposed 2014/2015 Goals listed below.

Background:

An Ad-Hoc Committee of the Antelope Valley State Water Contractors Association (AVSWCA) met to discuss the goals and direction of the AVSWCA. The Ad-Hoc Committee had Commissioner and General Manager representation from each of the member agencies. The focus of the Committee was to review and discuss the current "Statement of Principles and Objectives" for the AVSWCA and determine if there is a need or desire to update or revise said Principles and Objectives. The recommendation of the Committee is to leave the Statement of Principles and Objectives as they currently exist. The consensus was that they are sufficient and broad enough to fulfill all of the goals that the AVSWCA was originally formed to accomplish. The Committee however did recommend staff develop a list of short-term goals to present to the Commissioners for consideration in order to provide guidance and direction for AVSWCA staff.

2014/2015 Goals

- 1) Develop an agreement between AVEK, LCID, PWD, and Department of Water Resources (DWR) that recognizes the Antelope Valley as a closed groundwater basin should be considered as a State Water Project (SWP) Region as related to inter-agency SWP exchanges. This agreement will allow the three Antelope Valley SWP Contractors the ability to exchange SWP water without the need to obtain DWR approval for each specific exchange and allow a mechanism for the accounting and reporting of said exchanges. The AVSWCA staff will strive to have said agreement executed by the end of 2014, but recognizes due to the current statewide drought that DWR staff is busy dealing with statewide water supply transfers, etc;
- 2) Continue to be the contracting agency for the on-going United States Geological Survey (USGS) Joint Funding groundwater level and quality monitoring and mapping program for

the Antelope Valley. Funding these efforts will continue to be distributed based on member agency SWP Table A amounts. The USGS has committed to present an updated interactive map to the AVSWCA in early 2015;

- 3) Continue to be the monitoring and reporting agency for the California Statewide Groundwater Elevation Monitoring (CASGEM) Program. On November 4, 2009 the State Legislature amended the Water Code with SBx7-6, which mandates a statewide groundwater elevation monitoring program to track seasonal and long-term trends in groundwater elevations in California's groundwater basins. The intent of the CASGEM program is to establish a permanent, locally-managed program of regular and systematic monitoring in all of California's groundwater basins. The CASGEM program relies and builds on the established local long-term groundwater monitoring Joint-Funding Agreement between the USGS and AVSWCA. Funding these efforts will continue to be distributed based on member agency SWP Table A amounts;
- 4) Continue to be the agency that accounts for and disburses the Regional Water Management Group (RWMG) monetary contributions for projects and programs agreed to be funded with said monetary contributions;
- 5) Continue to be the lead agency that contracts with grant awarding agencies, consultants, and engineers to develop, study, and update the Antelope Valley-Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (AV-IRWMP);
- 6) Continue to encourage stakeholder input and participate in the AV-IRWMP Stakeholder and Advisory Team Meetings to provide input on water supply related topics;
- 7) Increase public outreach and public education of water supply issues facing the Antelope Valley. Periodically discuss which community events the AVSWCA shall participate in, and attend, based on current water issues and intended message.

BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014/2015

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Commissioners of the AVSWCA (Association) approve the attached proposed budget for fiscal year 2014/2015.

Background:

The proposed budget has been broken into three categories: General Operating Funds, Restricted Funds (USGS Groundwater Monitoring Program), and Restricted Funds (Antelope Valley Integrated Regional Water Management Plan).

On the Expenditure side for the General Operating Funds, the categories include:

• Insurance: Liability insurance for the Association obtained through

ACWA/JPIA

Memberships: Membership in ACWA

• Miscellaneous: Includes all miscellaneous expenses not covered in other

Association accounts (business cards, meals, etc.)

• Outreach: Includes the website, possible purchase of a tabletop display,

promotional items, and event fees

• Contract Services: (Administration): Services provided by AVEK (Tom Barnes –

Controller) and PWD (Dawn Deans – Executive Secretary,

Danielle Henry - Administrative Assistant, Matthew Knudson -

General Manager, Dennis Hoffmeyer – Finance)

On the Expenditure side for the Restricted Funds (USGS Groundwater Monitoring and CASGEM Program), the categories include:

• Contract Services (USGS): Consulting engineering services for a Joint Funding Agreement with the USGS for groundwater monitoring within the Antelope Valley. This also includes the collection of data to comply with the California Statewide Groundwater Elevation Monitoring Program.

On the Expenditure side for the Restricted Funds (AV Integrated Regional Water Management Plan), the categories include:

• Contract Services (AV-IRWMP): Consulting engineering services for work related to the Antelope Valley Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (on behalf of the Regional Water Management Group and the AV-IRWMP).

Per the bylaws of the Association, the first \$30,000 of member agency contributions is split evenly to cover General Operating Costs. Therefore, it is recommended that each of the three member agencies contribute \$8,000 in Fiscal Year 2014/2015 to the Association's General Operating Fund to cover the proposed 2014/2015 General Operating Costs of \$24,000.

The Association's share of the USGS groundwater monitoring program is estimated to be \$76,725.00 in order to make the Association whole on the commitments with the USGS. The Association's current policy for funding this program is to use State Water Project Table "A" amounts to determine the split among the member agencies. Based on this policy, the \$76,725.00 would be split among the member agencies as follows:

AVEK: \$65,753.00 (85.7%) PWD: \$9,898.00 (12.9%) LCID: \$1,074.00 (1.4%)

Total = \$76,725.00

Based on the General Operating Fund contributions, and the contributions for the USGS program, the following is the total amount each of the member agencies must commit if the attached 2014/2015 Budget is approved:

The total contribution for AVEK in 2014/15 will be \$73,753.00. The total contribution for PWD in 2014/15 will be \$17,898.00. The total contribution for LCID in 2014/15 will be \$9,074.00.

Re: Disclosure of Potential Conflict of Interests and Waiver re: Representation of Antelope Valley State Water Contractors Association

Dear Chair Hogan and President Mac Laren:

We are most pleased to have been appointed as the Palmdale Water District's General Counsel. As such, our firm will also be serving as General Counsel to the Antelope Valley State Water Contractors Association ("Association") pursuant to the pre-existing structure of the Association. As you know, the Association is a joint powers authority, whose members are the Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency ("AVEK"), the Littlerock Creek Irrigation District ("Littlerock Creek"), and the Palmdale Water District ("Palmdale"). We understand that the Association's governing board has determined that it is in the best interests of the Association to utilize each member's General Counsels to serve as General Counsel to the Association, on a rotating basis.

Palmdale's General Counsel was serving as Counsel to the Association at the time of our firm's transition as the District's General Counsel on March 3, 2014. Thus, we present this potential conflict disclosure and waiver request for our firm to also serve as Counsel to the Association. Although we have not identified any probable conflicts at this time, it presents this disclosure and waiver to ensure the Association is fully informed of the law related to concurrent representations and how that law relates to our firm's concurrent representation of the Association and Palmdale.

The California Rules of Professional Conduct preclude an attorney from representing a client in one matter and at the same time in a separate matter accepting as a client an entity whose interests potentially conflict to the client in the first matter without the informed written consent of each client (Rule 3-310(C)(1)).

This rule means that the partners and associate attorneys at my firm (including me), as attorneys for Palmdale, are precluded from providing services for a new client (the Association) if at the same time, we represent an existing client (Palmdale) in a matter where the Association's interests could potentially be adverse to Palmdale, without first obtaining the informed written consent of each client.

The specific rules that requires such consent are Rules 3-310 (A), (B) and (C) of the Rules of Professional Conduct, which provides as follows:

Rule 3-310. Avoiding the Representation of Adverse Interests

- (A) For purposes of this rule:
 - (1) "Disclosure" means informing the client or former client of the relevant circumstances and of the actual and reasonably foreseeable adverse consequences to the client or former client;
 - (2) "Informed written consent" means the client's or former client's written agreement to the representation following written disclosure;
 - (3) "Written" means any writing as defined in Evidence Code section 250.
- (B) A member shall not accept or continue representation of a client without providing written disclosure to the client where:
 - (1) The member has a legal, business, financial, professional, or personal relationship with a party or witness in the same matter; or
 - (2) The member knows or reasonably should know that:
 - (a) The member previously had a legal, business, financial, professional, or personal relationship with a party or witness in the same matter, and
 - (b) the previous relationship would substantially affect the member's representation; or
 - (3) The member has or had a legal, business, financial, professional, or personal relationship with another person or entity the member knows or reasonably should know would be affected substantially by resolution of the matter; or
 - (4) The member has or had a legal, business, financial, or professional interest in the subject matter of the representation.

- (C): A member shall not, without the informed written consent of each client:
 - (1) Accept representation of more than one client in a matter in which the interests of the clients potentially conflict; or
 - (2) Accept or continue representation of more than one client in a matter in which the interests of the clients actually conflict; or
 - (3) Represent a client in a matter and at the same time in a separate matter accept as a client a person or entity whose interest in the first matter is adverse to the client in the first matter.

The purpose of the Association is described in Exhibit A to the Joint Powers Agreement Creating the ... Association as follows:

"... to facilitate the coordinated development and implementation of plans and programs to satisfy their obligations consistent with their legal authority."

We understand Palmdale's interests are not currently adverse to the interests of the Association. However, as the Association begins to develop or implement any programs, Palmdale's interests may differ from the Association. For example, there could be disputes between Palmdale and the Association regarding the amount of Association resources allocated to particular activities, or disputes regarding each member's responsibilities in the event of a claim brought against the Association and/or any of its members.

To the extent Palmdale's interests may be adverse to the other member's interests in the Antelope Valley Groundwater Adjudication (the "Adjudication"), our firm does not represent Palmdale in that Adjudication and therefore its representation of the Association creates no conflicts related to the Adjudication, which consists of the following cases:

Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40 v. Diamond Farming Co., et al. Los Angeles County Superior Court, CaseNo. BC 325 201;

Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 40 v. Diamond Farming Co., et al. Kern County Superior Court, Case No. S-1500-CV-254-348; and

Wm. Bolthouse Farms, Inc. v. City of Lancaster
 Diamond Farming Co. v. City of Lancaster
 Diamond Farming Co. v. Palmdale Water District
 Riverside County Superior Court, Consolidated Action, Case Nos. RIC 353 840, RIC 344
 436, RIC 344 668.

In the event there is a dispute over the activities of the Association, the Palmdale's interests may become adverse to the Association. In the event such a dispute arises, where the Palmdale's interests are adverse to the Association, my firm and I would be obliged to disqualify ourselves from representing some or all of the entities in that dispute. The Association acknowledges and consents, unless ethically impossible under the circumstances, to my firm continuing to represent Palmdale in the event of a conflict between Palmdale and the Association.

In light of this potential conflict, however unlikely, it is appropriate for us to seek the Association's informed written consent of our representation of the Association on matters to which the Association is potentially, but not currently, adverse to Palmdale.

Accordingly, we request that the Association approve this disclosure and consent acknowledging that (i) the Association has been advised of Rule 3-310(c) and of the potential conflicts associated with our representation of the Association while at the same time representing Palmdale as its General Counsel; and (ii) the Association consents to my firm concurrently representing the Association and Palmdale.

The Association is encouraged to seek independent counsel at any time if the Association seeks legal guidance in the approval of this consent.

We look forward to working with the Association.
